Genealogy Center in Aberdeenshire

A new genealogy center is about to open in Peterhead, Aberdeen, Scotland. This is at the most eastern location in Scotland. The center will specialize in family history in the Aberdeen region. The center will be in a room at the Arbutnot Museum at St. Peter Street. The museum also has many documents of interest to genealogists. Funding for the genealogy center is being arranged by the Peterhead Tourism Initiative (PTI).

Scotland Census

Ancestry.com now has the complete census information for Scotland from the 1841 census to the 1901 census. The census collection contains more than 24 million names. It is said that more than 5 million Americans

descend from Scottish ancestors.

Ancestry.com does charge a subscription fee to access the database, and the census data for Scotland is not available at the less expensive rate which allows access to U. S. records. The Scottish census data can also be obtained from

www.scotlandspeople.gov.uk.

Ancestry.com Adds US-Canadian Border Crossings

Ancestry.com has done very well recently in finding major collections and adding them to its subscription database. The most recent addition is the collection of more than 4 million names of individuals who crossed the U.S.-Canadian border between 1895 and 1956. The Canadian border is an often overlooked but significant immigration route into the US. Since the US has limited immigration with quotas from various countries, it has been easier for some immigrants to go to Canada and then immigrate to the US from there.

The records came from more than 100 places of entry, from Washington State to Maine. The busiest of these locations include Niagara Falls, Buffalo, Detroit, Montreal, Vancouver and Toronto. Documents sometimes contain photos of immigrants similar to those used for passports. The records state the nationality of the individuals which can be helpful in determining the place where the

immigrant was born. The most common nationalities in the border crossing records are Russians, Italians and Chinese. Ancestry.com is a subscription site. It can be visited at:

1819/1820 U.S. Passenger List

GenealogyBank.com has digitized the complete 1819-1820 U.S. Passenger List and has published it on their Web site. The list includes passenger arrivals in 35 ports located in 14 states and the District of Columbia. The original document was published by the Federal Government in 1821. The lists also include births and deaths at sea, which are small in number but difficult to find. The passenger list is available free on the Web site.

GenealogyBank.com is a subscription site that has many records that are useful to genealogists. They have more than 1,300 U.S. newspapers, more than 103 Million obituaries and death records, and about 114,000 government reports and books including this passenger list. The records are all searchable.

LOOK AT ME

LOOK AT ME is a Web site collection of found photos. The collection contains 616 photos, all with nameless people, and without the name of the photographer or date taken. They may have been lost or thrown away. The Web site serves the same purpose as DeadFred.com and AncientFaces.com, two other sites for found pictures that have been around for a while.

The project began when a few photos found by Frederic Bonn and Zoe Deleu on a Paris street in 1998. The Web site is accepting additional lost photos. Finding a photo that you want is a long shot, but all you need to do is look and recognize the photo and download it.

Burke's Peerage

Burke's Peerage has a new Web site. The company has published books listing the genealogy of Irish and British peers, knights and landed gentry. The Burke's Peerage Online database includes detailed genealogical information on over 15,000 families (some going back over 1,000 years) whose members shaped the history and development of Britain and Ireland and North America. The site has detailed lineages of the kings and queens who ruled England and Scotland from the 9th century up to now, 42 US presidents, and 33 prime ministers of the UK. More than a million family members are included. Each of the family records has been researched by a team of professional genealogists to ensure that the information is accurate and reliable.

Besides the genealogy, there are essays on Britain's 18th and 19th century prime ministers and on US Presidents. In addition, more than 5,000 entries relate to currently popular personalities, including actors, politicians, artists, industrialists, architects, and musicians. Other features include a guide to castles and stately homes in the British Isles, essays on artists and craftsmen, and articles and essays on the culture and traditions of the British Isles.

The new site allows visitors to search for a family name or for the name of a person merely mentioned in the records. The

time period when a person was born, married or died; the places associated with a person; particular geographic region; or categories of record (such as Peerage, Contemporary, or American Families) can be specified in a search. NameX® (a proprietary name-matching tool) allows search for names even if the spelling is unknown. The records are structured so that both experienced and first time users can quickly search and find information. The generations of each family are color coded and indented to make the record much easier to read online than in the print editions.

The Burke's site is not free. The standard subscription rates are 24 hour access for £15.95 or annual access for £64.95. The site may be available at your public library. A list of libraries that carry the service are listed on the Web site. To visit the Burke's Peerage site, go to:
